



## **Trader Notice AHW 1/2017**

**To: Persons exporting animals live from the State**

**Subject:** Change in veterinary Inspection fees for **bovine animals under 3 months of age**, in relation to fees payable in accordance with Regulation 19 of SI No 432 of 2009 (European Communities (Food and Feed Hygiene) Regulations 2009) for official veterinary health certificates issued in respect of animals exported live from the State.

Please note that as of 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017, fees payable on bovine animals **under 3 months of age** exported live from the State will decrease to €1.20 per animal. Fees payable on bovine animals over 3 months of age will remain at €4.80 per animal. A full schedule of fees payable is below.
